REPORT

STUDY VISIT 17-23.02.2019, SERBIA

AIMS:

The aims of the visit werespace for exploring organization of youth work, types of youth work practiced within country (health education, active citizenship and political awareness, environmental protection and social exclusion), cooperation with youth field institutions and youth workers occupational standard. Study visit included joint sessions for presentation on youth work realities in Serbia and Estonia with the main aim to introduce institutional and legal framework on national, regional and local level, developed country mechanisms for quality of youth work, validation and education of youth workers in relation to occupational standards as well as on sight visits to youth work practiced among organizations in the field in order to explore methods and tools used within youth work practice. During the study visit participants had opportunity to met and get to know more about member organization of NAPOR, National Youth Council (KOMS), Ministry of youth and sports and OPENS.

EVALUATION:

On the question how will you rate the variety in types of youth work during the SV, participants replay that they "explored very different YW organisations and got an overview of good practices. It was good to travel to various places.

It was so fully, but very interesting. We got to see a variety of programs and working metodologies in a lot of organizations, which I liked and found usefull."

On the question What did you find the most useful during the study visit participants replays were: "Learning about different types of youth work. New contacts, nice talks- walks I got many ideas for projects and contacts for cooperation. Intercultural dimension of the study visit: evening, communication and learning. Also, how youth work is structured in Estonia is also valuable information for me. Getting insight of some organisations and the way they are working, also connecting with different people from different organisations and exchanging exsperience about youth work. Living library was one things that is still in thoughts! Contacts insight into another system, for comparing."

On the question How you will use this experience in your future work, participants replays were: I will make sure to apply all the methods of youth work that I found interesting and useful during the SV in our association's youth work. I will keep in contact for future cooperation. I will play more similar games with my youths I got really great ideas from Estonian participants which I do plan to implement in my future work. Raising awareness. Understanding its importance, in future work, even if it is not working with young people, I will implement many of the things that I have learned. Everything is connected in some way. I can be happy, because in Estonia is so good youth work system and government recognizes it.
